Formative Evaluation

After the practice of the specified procedures, including vital signs assessment, phlegm suction, feeding through the tube, medication and intravenous fluid and urinary catheterization, the test will be administered using the assessment form (NS 204-01) without scoring. It is an evaluation and recommendations for students for further development.

Evaluation

Students have to attend class at least 80 percent of the total class time to be eligible to take the exam. Norm-Referenced Evaluation is used. The passing criteria is 60 percent and higher. Grading includes $A B^+ B C^+ C$.

Evaluation of morality and ethics and or interpersonal relationships

It is based on the guidelines for evaluation of nursing courses, the manual of evaluation and grading of nursing courses (Revised version B.E. 2559) and (Revised version B.E. 2562).

Appeal channel

Appeal of course evaluation must be processed within 15 days after being informed of the score or study results. Students can inform the Appeal to the course coordinator. Then course coordinator will proceed accordingly based on the announcement of Faculty of Nursing, Srinakharinwirot University: Complaints of Students, dated 1 February 2019.
